Social Skills Day Camp FAQs

Location: Decatur Family YMCA off of Clairemont Avenue

Dates: June 4th—June 22nd (Monday—Friday)

9:00AM-4:00PM

Available Camps: General (ages 5—12) and Art Camp (ages 5—9)

Requirements

- Must be 5 12 years old
- Mandatory to attend all 3 weeks
- Toilet trained / cannot be on a specific toileting schedule
 - o This is a YMCA policy.
- Demonstrate vocal communication skills to indicate wants/needs, at least respond to questions with sentences or phrases, and display progress toward making statements and asking questions
- No current instances of elopement (i.e., running off), aggressive behavior, or disruptive behavior
 - There is no fence around the premises of the YMCA. Clairemont Avenue is a busy road. Also, this camp is not staffed 1:1.
- Parent orientation is mandatory either in person at Marcus Autism Center or via WebEx

How many campers?

- YMCA has approximately 100 to 150 campers daily
- Marcus Autism Center accepts 25 campers

Are the campers accepted by Marcus Autism Center in their own camp?

- No, it's a full inclusion camp model
- All campers are separated by age group
- Each group can have up to 14 campers in each group
- Typically 3-4 campers accepted by Marcus Autism Center in a group with up to 10 same age peers
- 4:1 camper to counselor ratio
- Marcus Autism Center campers follow the same schedule as the group they are assigned to

How are campers supported?

2 Marcus Autism Center Clinicians who are BCBAs are on-site each day

- Undergraduate interns (some seeking college credit) assist with prompting social skills
- All Marcus Autism Center staff wear YMCA STAFF shirts with no Marcus Autism Center /Children's Healthcare of Atlanta logos
- Interns are responsible for discreetly overseeing 3—4 campers

What happens when the campers arrive in the morning?

- All parents drop their children off similar to a school carpool line
- Upon arrival, the whole camp meets inside the gym for opening ceremonies
- Divided into their group during this time as counselors prep for the day

What activities are at camp?

• Indoor activities such as: swimming (specific days), tennis, karate, dancing, organized group games; outdoor activities such as: GAGA ball, jump rope, basketball, STEM, arts & crafts, water games, kickball, organized group games, on-site and off-site field trips

What does a typical camp day look like?

- *This is only an example.
 - 9:00AM Arrival / Opening Ceremony
 - *Morning activities are scheduled during specific times
 - 10:30AM Snack
 - 12:00PM Lunch
 - 1:00PM Swim
 - *Afternoon activities are scheduled during specific times
 - 2:45PM Snack
 - 3:30PM Closing Ceremony
 - 4:00PM Departure

Are early and after care available?

• Yes, this is set up directly with the YMCA. Early and after-care is for children who are able to be successful in a large-group and mainly unstructured environment. Participation in early and after-care services is monitored by YMCA staff and administration only.
